

ISA+21 SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES

In an effort to assist women whose goals are to fly for the world's airlines, ISA has earmarked funds for pilots who have made the decision to join ISA members in this great profession. The intent of the ISA Scholarship program is to award scholarships to those financially deserving women who best exemplify the qualities and potential that will lead to a successful career as an airline pilot. It has been our experience that superior performance in all life's endeavors is an excellent measuring tool of an individual's aptitude for success. Therefore, included in the criteria for selection are those human qualities that are difficult to grade but are essential components of personal achievement, success, and good citizenship.

THE ISA FINANCIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Financial Scholarship is a cash award paid directly to a flight school or training institute to assist women pursuing airline pilot careers with obtaining advanced airplane ratings: CFI, CFII, MEI, ME Commercial (SE COMM required to apply), or ATP. It does not have a set dollar amount to be awarded. Simply apply for the amount required to obtain the rating sought at your specific flight school of choice. Travel expenses, housing, and supplies are not to be included.

THE ISA AIRLINE SCHOLARSHIP

The Airline Scholarship provides aircraft type ratings to women actively pursuing airline pilot careers. These scholarships are due to generous donations from both individual and corporate sponsors. These type ratings vary from year to year based on sponsors and availability; therefore, an applicant cannot apply for a specific aircraft type rating. Simply apply for "Airline" on the application. Once awarded, the aircraft type and the corporate sponsor(s) will be announced to the winner.

REQUIREMENTS

Scholarships are available to women who are pursuing careers as airline pilots. All applicants must meet the following prerequisites:

- **ALL** applicants must have an U.S. FAA Commercial Pilot Certificate with an Instrument Rating and First Class Medical Certificate, or non-US equivalent *
- **FINANCIAL** Scholarship applicants must have flight time in a fixed wing aircraft commensurate with the rating sought. For ATP candidates, 1400TT and current ATP written required.
- **AIRLINE** Scholarship applicants must have a current FE written. Type Rating awards require an ATP Certificate and First Class Medical. Sponsors may stipulate additional requirements.

COMPLETED APPLICATION PACKETS

Your completed application packet should contain the following:

1. The completed application
2. Descriptive essay - should be enlightening and address the following areas:
 - Your aviation history and goals
 - How this scholarship will help you attain your goals
 - Your present financial need
 - Flight training in which you need assistance
 - How previous training was financed
 - Training facility and the cost (for financial only)
 - Educational scholarships, awards, and honors
 - Other information you feel would be beneficial
3. Resume - include previous work experience on your resume
4. Three recommendation letters:
 - Two recommendation letters should be aviation related,
and one should be community or employer related
5. Copies of all pilot and medical certificates
6. Copies of the last two pages of your logbook
7. Copy of latest tax return
8. 2" x 2" recent passport photo (for use in ISA+21 newsletter & website)
9. For Airline applicants, copy of current flight engineer written test results
10. For Financial applicants applying for ATP, copy of current ATP written test results

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

One copy of the above documents should be placed in individual sheet protectors and bound in a portfolio

Two additional stapled copied sets should be included (You should have 3 full sets in your completed packet to be mailed)

Completed applications and other documents should be typed. The application is a fill-in form on our website www.iswap.org.

ISA SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINES

December 10, 2007 Postmark deadline for completed application packet

January thru March - Applications reviewed & interviews scheduled

March - Interviews conducted at Women in Aviation Conference, or in applicant's home town or domicile

April - Interview selections processed

May - Winners announced at ISA +21 Convention

Once submitted, application packets become the property of ISA and cannot be returned. It is highly recommended that a copy of your application be made prior to submission. In the event a packet is lost in the mail, we also recommend you keep a copy of your mailing receipt. It has happened in the past, protect your hard work!
